

Over 60 workers of Imran Khan's party arrested in Lahore in connection with May 9 attacks

LAHORE : (AGENCY)

More than 60 leaders and workers of jailed former prime minister Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party have been arrested here in Punjab province in connection with the attacks on military installations in May, police said on Wednesday, an act described as "illegal fascist measures" by the party. Police action against the PTI leaders and workers has been intensified across the country following the announcement of general elections in Pakistan on February 8, 2024.

These are fresh arrests in addition to those already arrested on May 9 and soon after. According to the PTI, over 10,000 of its leaders and workers have been in jail since early May in connection with attacks on military and state installations following Khan's arrest in an alleged corruption case. "The police arrested 62 PTI workers involved in the May 9 attack on Lahore Corps Command and torching of a plaza (allegedly owned by the son of former army chief Gen



Qamar Javed Bajwa) in different parts of the city on Tuesday," a Lahore police statement said on Wednesday. It said a crackdown has been launched against those involved in attacks on military installations but evaded arrest. A heavy contingent of police also raided the residence of PTI president Chaudhry Farveez Elahi to arrest his relative and former lawmaker Maj (R) Tahir Sadiq. Elahi is already in jail. PTI senior leader and

former federal minister Moonis Elahi said the Punjab police's brutalities against the PTI leaders and workers are at their peak as they are not sparing even women. On May 9, following the arrest of Khan by paramilitary Rangers, unrest broke out in Pakistan that saw the torching and vandalising of dozens of military and state buildings, including the Army headquarters in Rawalpindi and the ISI building in Faisalabad.

Police arrested over 10,000 workers of PTI, and over 100 are being tried under the Army Act. The PTI core committee has also strongly denounced the "state's coercive tactics, reprisal actions" against the PTI workers and leaders even after the announcement of the polls date. "We condemn the illegal fascist measures of the state against peaceful political activities before the elections. The nation will not accept rigged polls held in such an uneven electoral

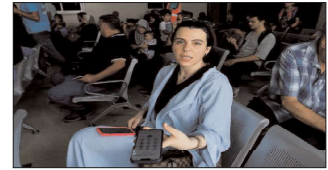
field and with state interference," it said and added that after fixing the date of the poll, the reprehensible attempts to force the PTI out of the electoral arena and deprive it of a level playing field have become more prominent before the world. The PTI core committee asked the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) to avoid playing the role of an auctioneer in poll rigging (and) rather it should ensure a level playing field for all political parties to hold free, fair and transparent elections in the country. It also paid glowing tribute to PTI chairman Imran Khan for facing the "unjustifiable" incarceration with steadfastness, courage and perseverance. "The PTI will take part in the elections and Imran Khan will lead the party's election campaign across the country," it said and added Khan has been in jail for over 100 days without any legal justification, and was being merely subjected to political revenge. Khan has been lodged at Adiala Jail at Rawalpindi in the cipher case in which he is accused of leaking state secrets. A

Fleeing Gaza is 'horror movie on repeat', says Suzan Beseiso who finally escaped after four failed attempts

It took four failed attempts before Suzan Beseiso was able to get through the Rafah crossing into Egypt and escape the bombardment of the Gaza Strip. On each occasion, the 31-year-old Palestinian American, one of several hundred foreign passport holders allowed to leave the enclave since last week, said she faced acute danger.

"Every single time we went to the border, we got bombed and freaked out," she said on Sunday during an interview in Cairo, where she arrived after crossing the Sinai Peninsula by road. "Bombs are going left and right." After Israel imposed a total siege on Gaza in retaliation for an October 7 incursion by Hamas, the Rafah crossing was the only crossing out of Gaza that does not border Israel — remained out of operation for nearly two weeks amid diplomatic wrangling over conditions for allowing aid to enter and evacuees to leave. Since then, a trickle of relief has been trucked into Gaza and some evacuees have left.



though the arrangement is fragile and was suspended on Saturday before resuming on Monday. The month-long year has caused a deepening humanitarian crisis in Gaza as Israel's military campaign has intensified, with many of the territory's 2.3 million inhabitants repeatedly displaced as they struggle to find shelter and safety. Beseiso, who has spent about half her life in Gaza and half in the U.S., said she had crammed with relatives into a single room in a stranger's house, ran short of food and water, and endured sleepless nights during air strikes.

"It's just a horror movie that keeps putting on repeat," she said. "No sleep. No food. No water. You keep evacuating from one place

to another." On one occasion, she was in a resting-area next to the border with her sister and cousin and panicked when she heard a strike fall near where her mother, father, and nephew were waiting outside. They narrowly escaped, she said, but the Palestinians received an order to shut the border and the family retreated in a terrifying taxi ride back into Gaza. "On our way to the house, gunships were bombing the beach area, and the bombs were just flying on top of our heads. Left and right, and the airplanes were just bombing as well."

Record 7.5 million people globally diagnosed with tuberculosis in 2022 : WHO

A total of 7.5 million people were diagnosed with tuberculosis in 2022, the highest recorded since WHO began global TB monitoring in 1995, according to a report featuring data from 192 countries and areas. The World Health Organization (WHO) 2023 Global tuberculosis (TB) report also shows that globally, an estimated 10.6 million people fell ill with TB in 2022, up from 10.3 million in 2021.

The report underscores a significant worldwide recovery in the scale-up of TB diagnosis and treatment services in 2022. It shows an encouraging trend starting to reverse the detrimental effects of COVID-19 disruptions on TB services. The increase in diagnosis is attributed to good recovery

in access to and provision of health services in many countries, WHO said.

India, Indonesia and the Philippines, which together accounted for over 60 per cent of the global reduc-



tions in the number of people newly diagnosed with TB in 2020 and 2021, all recovered to beyond 2019 levels in 2022, it said. "For millennia, our ancestors suffered and died with tuberculosis, without knowing what it was, what caused it or how to stop it," said Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus.

Five members of two Indian-origin families killed after SUV crashes into pub in Melbourne

Five members of two Indian-origin families in Australia, including two children, have been killed when a luxury SUV ploughed into a packed outdoor dining area of a pub here, leaving the Indian community devastated. Vivek Bhatia (38), his son Vihan (11), Pratibha Sharma (44), her daughter, Anvi (nine), and partner Jatin Chugh (30) died after the BMW mounted a kerb and hit patrons on the front

lawn of the Royal Deylesford hotel on Sunday evening, the Sydney Morning Herald reported.

Sharma and her family were enjoying a holiday with family friends, Bhatia and his son Vihan, who died instantly in the crash, while Bhatia's 36-year-old wife, Ruchi, and six-year-old son Abeer were taken to hospital with serious injuries, the report said. Abeer was initially in critical condition with broken legs and internal injuries but has since been sta-

bilised. There are many others, including a baby, who were injured in the accident and have been shifted to a hospital for treatment. The driver of the white BMW Sports Utility Vehicle has been interviewed by police in hospital following the crash. The unnamed man, a 66-year-old from Mount

Macedon, was spoken to by police on Tuesday but was not arrested or charged.

"At this time, the driver has not been charged, with inquiries to continue after his eventual release from care," a police statement provided to the Herald Sun said. Meanwhile, the distraught family of one of the

crash victims, Sharma, has revealed their final conversation with the beloved team. Her father Vikas said she had spoken to her mother Urmila just two hours before her death. "She said they were staying in a beautiful house all together," he told the Herald Sun. Urmila said "She said

tomorrow I will come home early." She said they tried to call Pratibha later that night but there was "no reply." "We thought it was okay and there was no need to disturb them because they were enjoying themselves," he said, expressing his disbelief at his hard-working,
