Trump's advice to Mamdani after stunning NYC win : 'He should be nice to me, I'm the one...'

NEW YORK : (AGENCY)

US President Donald Trump has turned New York City Mayor-elect Zohran Mamdani's victory speech on election night a "very angry" address, saying he is off to a bad start and doesn't have a chance of succeeding if he is not respectful of Washington.

"Yeah, I thought it was a very angry speech, certainly angry toward me, and I think he should be very nice to me. You know, I'm the one that sort of has to approve a lot of things coming to him. So he's off to a bad start," Trump said in an interview to Fox News in Miami on Wednesday when asked about Mamdani's victory speech. In his fiery address, Mamdani challenged Trump and heralded the toppling of "fascist dynasty." New York mayoral poll winner Mamdani's Punjab Connection goes back to India's 1st birth control study. Amid Trump's crackdown on immigration, Mamdani said New York will be powered by immigrants and after his historic victory, it will be "led by an



immigrant." "After all, if anyone can show a nation betrayed by Donald Trump how to defeat him, it is the city that gave rise to him. And if there is any way to terrify a despot, it is by dismantling the very conditions that allowed him to accumulate power," Mamdani said to thunderous applause. "This is not only how we stop Trump. It's how we stop the next one. So, Donald Trump, since I know you're watching, I have four words for

you: Turn the volume up. "We will hold him landlords to account because the Donald Trumps of our city have grown far too comfortable taking advantage of their tenants. We will put an end to the culture of corruption that has allowed billionaires like Trump to evade taxation and exploit tax breaks. "We will stand alongside unions and expand labour protection because we know, just as Donald Trump does, that when working people have

ironed rights, the bosses who seek to extort them become very small indeed. "New York will remain a city of immigrants: a city built by immigrants, powered by immigrants and as of tonight, led by an immigrant," Mamdani said. "So hear me, President Trump, when I say this: To get to any of us, you will have to get through all of us," he added. When asked how he would respond to Mamdani's tirade against him, Trump said it is a "very

dangerous statement for him to make actually".

"And you know, you talk about danger, I think it's a very dangerous statement for him to make. He has to be a little bit respectful of Washington, because if he's not, he doesn't have a chance of succeeding," the president said. Trump added that he doesn't want to make Mamdani succeed but "I want to make the city succeed, and we'll see what happens".

When asked if he would reach out to him, Trump said that Mamdani should reach out to us really. "I think he should reach out. To be sure, we'll see what happens. But I would think that it would be more appropriate for him to reach out to us," Trump added that he is "so torn, because I would like to see the new mayor do well, because I love New York. I really love New York". Trump, who calls Mamdani a "communist", said that for thousands of years, communism has not worked. "Communism or the concept of communism has not worked."

Philippines declares state of emergency after at least 114 persons were left dead

Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Jr declared a state of emergency on Thursday after Typhoon Kalmegi left at least 114 people dead and hundreds missing in central provinces in the deadliest natural disaster to hit the country this year. The deaths were mostly from drowning in flash floods, and 127 people were still missing, many in the hard-hit central province of Cebu. The tropical cyclone blew out of the archipelago on Wednesday into the South China Sea.

The typhoon's onslaught affected nearly 2 million people and displaced more than 5,60,000 villagers, including nearly 4,50,000 who were evacuated to emergency shelters. The Office of Civil Defence said, Marcos' "state of national calamity" declaration, made during a meeting with disaster-response officials to assess the typhoon's aftermath, would allow the government to disburse emergency funds faster and prevent food hoarding and hoarding of supplies. Officials said at least 71 people died in Cebu months due to drownings, while 65 others were reported missing and 69 injured. The Office of Civil



Deence said. It added that 62 others were reported missing in the central province of Negros Occidental, which is located near Cebu. "We did everything we could across the typhoon but, you know, there are really some unexpected things like flash floods," Cebu Gov Pamela Baricardo said. The problems may have been made worse by years of quarrying that caused clogging of nearby rivers, which overflooded and submerged flood control projects in Cebu province, Baricardo said. A corruption scandal involving substandard or non-existent flood control projects has sparked public outrage and street protests in recent months. Cebu was still recovering from a 6.9 magnitude earthquake on Sept 30 that left at least 79 people dead and displaced thousands when houses collapsed or were severely damaged. Thousands of northern Cebu residents who were displaced by the earthquake were moved to sturdier evacuation shelters from filmy before the typhoon struck. Baricardo said Northern towns devastated by the earthquake were mostly.

Trump backs off federal funding threat, says he'll help Mamdani 'a little bit'

Days after warning that he could slash federal funding to New York City if Zohran Mamdani won the mayoral race, US President Donald Trump appeared to back-track on his stance after Mamdani's decisive win on Tuesday. Speaking at America Business Forum in Miami on Wednesday, Trump, who had earlier called Mamdani a "communist", suggested he was open to offering limited federal support to New York, despite his sharp criticism of the incoming Mayor. "The communist, Mamdani, and his globalist handlers, they delivered nothing but disaster. And now let's see how a communist does in New York," Trump said, before adding, "We're going to see how that works out. And we'll help them. We'll help them. We want New York to be successful. We'll help them a little bit, maybe." The remarks mark a shift from Trump's earlier warning ahead of the election, when he threatened to restrict federal funding "other than the very minimum as required". If Mamdani emerged victorious, in a Truth Social post last week, Trump said New York



would face a "complete and total disaster" under Mamdani's leadership and vowed not to send "good money after bad". In his Miami speech, however, Trump maintained his criticism of Mamdani's political ideology, calling him a "communist", and linking his rise to what he described as a broader leftward drift within the Democratic Party. "If you want to see what Congressional Democrats wish to do to America, just look at the results of yesterday's election in New York, where their party installed a communist as the mayor of the largest city in the nation," Trump said at the American Business Forum. "Remember, I said we will never have a socialist elected to any post in our country? I used to say that... we

skipped socialists, we put in the communists instead." Despite the biting tone, Trump's later comments about "helping" New York mark a subtle but notable shift from his earlier comments. Zohran Mamdani, a self-proclaimed Democratic socialist, achieved a historic win as voters turned New York City blue once again. The 34-year-old Assemblyman from Queens became the city's first Muslim mayor and its youngest leader in over a century, defeating former Governor Andrew Cuomo, who ran as an independent, and Republican Curtis Sliwa. Born in Uganda to filmmaker Mira Nair and academic Mahmood Mamdani, the new mayor secured more than a million votes, the highest for any New York mayoral candidate in three decades, according to The Hill. Mamdani garnered 50.6 per cent of the votes, while Cuomo trailed at 41.7 per cent. As conflict erupted down at his victory bash, Mamdani channelled his Indian roots with poetic flair, quoting Nehru's iconic Independence Day address in 1947, the "Tyrant with Destiny". Speaking to his supporters, Mamdani cited Nehru's words.

India airlifts 270 nationals from Thailand who fled Myanmar's cyber scam hub

In a major rescue and repatriation effort, India on Thursday brought back 270 of its nationals, including 26 women, from Thailand's Mae Sot town after they allegedly escaped from cyber scam centres operating across the border in Myanmar's lawless region. The operation was coordinated by the Embassy of India in Bangkok and the Consulate in Chiang Mai in close collaboration with Thai authorities. Two special Indian Air Force (IAF) flights were deployed to ferry the rescued citizens back home. According to official sources, the Indian nationals were detained by Thai authorities for illegally crossing the border from Myanmar, where they were reportedly employed in cyber fraud syndicates. The repatriation was facilitated in coordination with various agencies of the Royal Thai Government. The Indian Embassy in Thailand said many of the rescued individuals are believed to have been victims of job scams, lured with false promises of lucrative IT employment opportunities, only to find themselves forced into



online fraud operations in lawless enclaves run by transnational criminal syndicates. The embassy added that both Indian Missions in Thailand and Myanmar are continuing efforts to secure the release and return of more nationals still stranded in Myanmar's scam hubs. The repatriation comes days after New Delhi confirmed plans to bring back around 500 Indians trapped in similar circumstances in Thailand and Myanmar following a crackdown on cybercrime operations by Myanmar's military in the notorious KK Park compound and nearby zones. Indian authorities have once again cautioned citizens against falling prey to false job advertisements, urging them to verify the credentials of recruiting agents and employers before accepting overseas employment. "Visa-free entry into Thailand for Indian passport holders is meant strictly for tourism and short business."

Surveillance heightened along Nepal-India border as polls begin in Bihar

Surveillance along the Nepal-India border in Dhanusha district has been stepped up as the phased election in neighbouring Bihar began on Thursday. Security forces from Nepal and India have increased vigilance and surveillance at the Jaitari border checkpoint in Dhanusha that borders India. On Thursday, the border crossing was closed from 5 AM to 6 PM (local time) as the first phase of the Bihar assembly elections began. The Indian administration has stated that the border has been closed with the aim of tightening security in the border area during the election period and preventing possible unwanted activities. Security personnel from both Nepal and India have been deployed in the border area. Keeping security on high alert during the election period, the administrations of both countries have coordinated and heightened checks. According to Ganesh Bahadur Bam, Deputy Superintendent.

Mexico President presses charges against harasser

MEXICO CITY : (AGENCY) Mexico's President Claudia Sheinbaum is pressing charges against a man who she said was "drunk" and harassed her on Tuesday, calling the incident "an assault on all women." CNN reported. The man was arrested overnight, according to Mexico City Mayor Clara Brugada, and is in custody at the Sex Crimes Investigation Unit. The incident took place on Tuesday when a man broke through a crowd of people greeting Sheinbaum in Mexico City and appeared to grope her, according to viral footage of the incident. The video showed a man approach Sheinbaum. He appeared to touch her breast, and attempt to kiss her while bystanders in the central neighbourhood of Zocalo watched. The incident ended when one of her top aides, Juan Jose Ramirez Mendez, intervened as per CNN. The episode has sparked outrage online and renewed a debate over harassment and the safety of women in public life. Mexico City police said preliminary findings link the individual to the alleged harassment of two other women that same day.

Balochistan faces fresh attacks amid continued neglect

QUETTA : (AGENCY) In yet another alarming reminder of Balochistan's worsening security climate, unidentified armed men carried out two separate attacks on Tuesday evening, one in Kachhi district and the other in Quetta, raising fresh questions about the state's preparedness and ongoing neglect of the region's security needs, as reported by Dawn. In two separate incidents, unidentified armed groups attacked a police station in Kachhi district and targeted a security checkpoint on Quetta's Western Bypass with hand grenades. According to officials, around 20 heavily armed assailants stormed the Khatian Police Station in Kachhi district. The outpost recently set up inside a repurposed Livestock Department building following the merger of levies.

Pakistan, Afghanistan set to begin third round of talks in Istanbul

ISLAMABAD : (AGENCY)

Pakistan is set to resume talks with Afghan Taliban representatives in Istanbul today in a third round of engagement aimed at ending cross-border terrorism and consolidating a fragile ceasefire that was initially agreed upon after border clashes last month. Dawn said. Since the skirmishes between October 11 and 15, Pakistan and Afghan Taliban representatives have held two rounds of talks, first in Doha and then in Istanbul, but a final agreement has not yet been reached. Dawn added. For the third round, under the joint mediation of Turkey and Qatar, delegations from both sides arrived in Istanbul on Wednesday. The talks are expected to continue for two days. Pakistan's delegation is being led by Lt Gen Asim Malik, Director General of the Inter-Services Intelligence, which includes senior officials



from the military, intelligence agencies, and the Foreign Office, Dawn reported. The Afghan Taliban's delegation includes General Directorate of Intelligence chief Abdul Haq Waseq, Deputy Interior Minister Rahmatullah Najib, Taliban spokesperson Suhail Shaheen, Anas Haqqani, Qahar Balkhi, Zakir Jalal, and Afghanistan's charge d'affaires in Ankara. A joint statement released by the Turkish foreign ministry following the last round of talks said that "all parties have agreed on continuation of ceasefire" and "to

put in place a monitoring and verification mechanism agreed in principle last week. Officials in both Islamabad and Kabul have kept expectations low about the upcoming dialogue. Pakistan military and intelligence officials have stated that Islamabad's position remains unchanged, that Afghan soil must not be used for terrorism against Pakistan. The Pakistan military and intelligence service have a single-point agenda -- the end of terrorism," military spokesman Lt Gen Ahmed Sharif Chaudhry said earlier this week. Another security official speaking on anonymity, said Islamabad seeks "concrete, verifiable guarantees," Dawn reported. Talks between Pakistan and the Afghan Taliban follow weeks of shuttle diplomacy after deadly border clashes last month plunged relations between the two neighbours to their lowest point since the Taliban seized power in Kabul in 2021.
